FLORIDA CALENDAR

The best times of year for certain activities along with a way to participate and important conservation message.

Sea Turtle Nesting Season (March–October)

Activity: Participate in a guided sea turtle walk to observe nesting and hatching.

Conservation Message: Learn about the importance of protecting sea turtle habitats and the role of conservation efforts in their survival.

Coral Spawning (August–September)

Activity: Visit a marine research center or aquarium during coral spawning season to learn about this natural phenomenon.

Conservation Message: Understand the significance of coral reefs and how they support marine biodiversity.

Manatee Migration (November–March)

Activity: Take a guided tour to see manatees in their natural warm-water habitats.

Conservation Message: Discover why manatees migrate and how protecting warm-water springs is crucial for their survival.

Florida Ocean Day (March)

Activity: Attend events and activities organized to celebrate Florida Ocean Day, such as educational exhibits and interactive workshops.

Conservation Message: Explore various ocean conservation initiatives and how individuals can contribute.

Shark Awareness Day (July 14)

WRITING PROMPTS

These prompts can inspire creativity and provide an educational way for kids to learn about Florida's unique locations and history.

A Day at the Theme Park

Beachcombing on the Gulf Coast

Prompt: "You spend a day beachcombing on Florida's Gulf Coast. Describe the treasures you find washed up on the shore, such as seashells, driftwood, or even a message in a bottle. What stories do these items tell, and what do you decide to do with them?"

A Night at the Kennedy Space Center

Prompt: "Imagine you get to spend a night at the Kennedy Space Center and witness a rocket launch. Write a story about your experience, including the preparations, the launch itself, and how it feels to see a spacecraft take off into space. What do you learn about space exploration?"


